Objective	Lead	Update November 2022
Monitor changes to the curriculum to ensure they result in good outcomes for pupils in all vulnerable groups, and to review the curriculum considering new performance measures	DHT/Head	 Changes are monitored throughout the year by teachers. Teachers record progress via data-drops 4 times a year. Senior leaders conduct a book scrutiny throughout the year to assess the knowledge and progress of the pupils. Individual targets are set for each student in each subject using this monitoring and changes to the curriculum including individual learning programmes are implemented.
Offer appropriate qualifications in English for pupils in all vulnerable groups	ELT	 Pupils have been given the opportunity to undertake alternative qualifications other than GCSE in Entry Level and Functional Skills exams in English.
Implement effective strategies to support pupils in all vulnerable groups following linear exam courses	SBM/Head	 Pupils have been given 1-1 adult support, targeted interventions and extra time in exams to support them. Homework club with a qualified teacher three lunchtimes each week has given extra support where required.
Maintain and improve the quality of support for pupils in all vulnerable groups in the classroom	DHT	 Extra Teaching Assistants have been employed to provide further support for pupils in the classroom. These Teaching Assistants have received training in Deaf Awareness to further support pupils effectively.
Continue to explore the use of new technologies to support pupils in all vulnerable groups in accessing their learning. With special investigation taking place regarding the use of technology in modern foreign languages, internal exams and group work	DHT	 Teachers have provided 1-1 support where identified using new Century Tech technology to support pupils with class work. UniFrog has been developed to support all secondary pupils with career advice and character building. Internal exams have used computer based reading tests and 'CATS' are administered for all new pupils. Modern Foreign Languages use of Kahoot and Blockit and interactive whiteboard technology.
