Maths

The anxiety and low confidence that students can face with maths can usually be overcome by improving fluency in dealing with number, such as basic counting or times tables.

This activity is done in morning form time on a Tuesday and Thursday, but the numbers refresh daily so it could be something your child could be encouraged to do on a daily basis at a home too. As they get better, trying to reach the numbers 1-10 in order increases the level of challenge.
